
Practical Information for Participants

1. How to get to the Hilton Hotel Sydney?

- Sydney Airport is connected to the city by Airport Link trains (approx. 25 AU\$) and Airport Express buses (approx. 7 AU\$).
- Taxis are available outside the terminal and cost approximately 30 AU\$ to the hotel. The hotel is located opposite the monorail station and 100 metres from the Town Hall railway station.
- Sydney's extensive rail network includes an underground city-centre line. Buses are widely available, but taxis are recommended for first-time visitors.
- Driving directions: From Sydney Airport, follow the signs for Southern Cross Drive then the signs for City 1 and Eastern Distributor. Enter William Street via the City/Kings Cross exit and stay in the left-hand lane. After the toll, turn left into William Street, continue straight ahead into Park Street, turn right onto Pitt Street and the Hilton Sydney hotel is on your left.



2. Public transports in Sydney

• Rail

The railway network spreads from Bondi Junction in the east to the Blue Mountains in the west. Services depart at least every 30 mins to most areas and inner city trains depart every few minutes.

Monorail

Sydney Monorail operates every day of the year from early until late. The Monorail runs every 3 to 5 minutes linking the City with Darling Harbour providing easy access to many of Sydney's tourist attractions. There are monorail stops at the Sydney Convention and Exhibition Centre, Haymarket, World Square, Park Plaza, City Centre and Darling Park. The standard fare is AU\$2.50 and all day tickets are available for AU\$6.

Light Rail

Light Rail Sydney operates 24 hours a day every day of the year. Trams run 10 to 15 minutes apart. Services run from Sydney Central to Wentworth Park. Fares are between AU\$2 and AU\$3 each way.

Buses

There are bus routes to everywhere, however, frequency varies and some services only operate in peak times. State Transit also operates a sightseeing tour throughout the city called the Sydney Explorer. Normal bus fares are based on distance and range from AU\$1.20 to AU\$4.60. 
